Food insecurity in Northern New Hampshire is a serious issue affecting many individuals and families.

According to a report by Feeding America, an estimated 10.6% of the population in Coos County, which is located in Northern New Hampshire, is food insecure. This means that approximately 3,440 individuals in Coos County are experiencing hunger or do not have access to enough nutritious food to maintain a healthy and active lifestyle.

In addition to Coos County, other counties in Northern New Hampshire, such as Grafton and Carroll, also have food insecurity rates above the national average. Many factors contribute to food insecurity in the region, including high poverty.



Fortunately, Granite United Way collaborates with many organizations like food banks, food pantries and meal programs that address food insecurity in Northern New Hampshire. These organizations rely on donations and volunteers to help provide food assistance to those in need. Some of our local partners include:

- The Community Cafe provides an opportunity for individuals, families, seniors, veterans, and anyone in need to receive a home-cooked meal.
- The Feeding Hope Food Pantry offers a free food resource in a safe and friendly environment to individuals who are food insecure.
