



# Opioid Abatement Community Grant Program (OACGP) Progress Report

## Executive Summary

The first response grant cycle of the Opioid Abatement Community Grant Program (OACGP) opened on October 1, 2025 and closed on October 31, 2025. Twenty-nine applications were reviewed by a team of four. Of these, twenty-six are recommended for funding; three will receive outreach and technical assistance to strengthen potential resubmissions. Overall, applicant proposals reflected strong alignment with program strategies and broad geographic representation.

## Program Highlights

**Strategic Alignment:** Projects addressed the continuum of prevention, treatment, harm reduction, recovery, and community capacity building, in keeping with OACGP priorities.

**Geographic Diversity:** Submissions represented communities across New Hampshire, ensuring statewide impact.

**Applicant Engagement:** Organizations expressed appreciation for the individualized, 1:1 support provided by the OACGP team throughout the application process.

## CYCLE 1 Funding Overview

A total of 26 organizations is recommended for award, supporting evidence-based/informed, community-driven initiatives that address critical needs related to SUD/OD. Award notifications will be distributed on November 17, 2025. Grant agreements will be executed promptly with funded organizations. Disbursement is to be made within 15 business days of acceptance.
